Pigeon Harness




Pigeons have been used for over 3,000 years to carry long distance messages, especially during wartime. Some birds have flown over 600 miles in one day. Pigeons in World War I and World War II were trained to fly at least 50 miles without stopping before they were used to carry messages. Soldiers and spies could place messages in small tubes attached to the birds' legs. The birds would instinctively fly back home, carrying the messages with them. This mesh harness from World War II allowed a soldier to carry a pigeon strapped to his chest for up to six hours. The pigeon could then be released from any location and sent home with important information.

Funding

Inspire! Grants for Small Museums; Institute of Museum and Library Services

Necessary Funding

\$540 a year for 25,000 entries, 100GB, and 10 users (CatalogIt)

I recommend hiring a registrar/collections management position to spearhead this project.

Goal of Program

Designed to support small museums in project-based efforts to serve the public

Three categories:

- Lifelong Learning
- Institutional Capacity
- Collections Stewardship and Access

Amount

Between \$5,000 - \$75,000

Grant period is 1-3 years


